

RCOC WILL REPLACE AVON BRIDGE OVER CLINTON RIVER, CONSTRUCT ROUNDABOUT AT AVON/DEQUINDRE

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) will replace the Avon Road bridge over the Clinton River just east of the south leg of Dequindre Road and will construct a roundabout at the Avon/Dequindre intersection. The work will take place from November 2021 through August of 2022.

PROJECT DETAILS

The RCOC project includes:

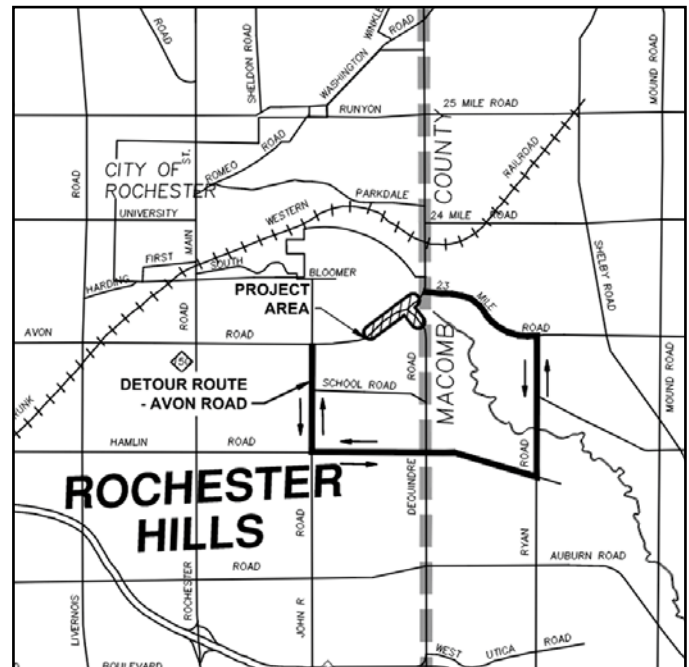
- Removal and replacement of the Avon Road bridge over the Clinton River just east of the south leg of Dequindre.
- Installation of a roundabout at the Avon Road/Dequindre Road intersection.
- Reconstruction of a quarter mile of East Avon Road including milling and resurfacing between Cider Mill Boulevard and the roundabout.
- Replacement of curbs, gutters and guardrails.
- Stabilization of the banks of the Clinton River.
- Replacement of storm sewers, water main and street lighting.
- Construction of a retention pond and placement of decorative concrete with aesthetic features.
- Installation of High-Intensity Crosswalk (HAWK) pedestrian signals at all legs of the roundabout.
- Updated pathways on both sides of this section of Avon Road.

IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

Avon Road will be closed to through traffic from John R Road to 23 Mile Road throughout the project.

Dequindre Road will be closed to through traffic from Hamlin Road to Avon Road throughout the project.

Both closures will begin approximately Nov. 1. The roads



are expected to re-open in August of 2022.

During the closures, access to all homes and businesses within the project area, including Yates Cider Mill, will be maintained at all times, though the road will be completely closed at the bridge.

The detour for Avon Road through traffic is John R Road to Hamlin Road to Ryan Road to 23 Mile Road and vice versa. The detour route for Dequindre Road is Hamlin Road east to Ryan Road to 23 Mile Road and back to Dequindre Road and vice versa.

SCHEDULE

- Utility relocation: ongoing
- Bridge and roundabout construction: Nov. 1 through August 2022.

PROJECT COST AND FUNDING

The roundabout and bridge are expected to cost approximately \$8.7 million. The project is funded with federal, RCOC and Rochester Hills dollars.
