

12 MILE RESURFACING, TELEGRAPH TO LAHSER, TO START IN JUNE

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC), in partnership with the City of Southfield, expects to begin work on the resurfacing of 12 Mile Road between Telegraph Road and Lahser Road in June.



PROJECT DETAILS

This project involves milling (grinding off the top layer of existing pavement) and repaving this one-mile section of 12 Mile Road. It will include some curb and gutter replacement, reconstructing pedestrian crosswalk ramps to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), new bus-stop pads, installation of new pedestrian crosswalk signals and guardrail improvements.

SCHEDULE AND IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

The project is expected to start in early June of 2020 and be completed in the fall of 2020.

One lane in each direction will remain open throughout the project. Access to all

homes and business along the road will be maintained at all times.

FUNDING

The project is expected to cost approximately \$1.7 million. It is being funded by RCOC, the City of Southfield and Oakland County general government (through the Tri-Party Program).

The contractor for the project is Cadillac Asphalt of Farmington Hills.
