

# DIXBORO ROAD TO CLOSE OCT. 1 FOR INITIAL WORK ON PAVING 8 TO 9 MILE

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC), in partnership with the City of South Lyon, Lyon Township and Green Oak Township, expects to close Dixboro Road between Eight Mile Road and Nine Mile Road on Oct. 1 to begin work needed to pave the gravel road.



## PROJECT DETAILS

This project involves paving Dixboro Road from 8 Mile Road to 9 Mile Road. It also includes the construction of concrete curbs and gutters, improved roadway drainage and the replacement of twin culverts under the road.

## IMPACT ON TRAFFIC AND SCHEDULE

Initial work in 2019 will involve replacing two culverts under this section of Dixboro Road as well as removing poor soils from several sections of the road. This work is expected to be completed and the road re-opened in December.

The road will then close again in April for the paving phase of the project. During both closures, the **detour route** will be 8 Mile Road to Pontiac Trail to 9 Mile Road, back to Dixboro Road and vice versa.

Access to properties along this section of Dixboro

Road will be maintained at all times during the project, though access will be either from the north or south, depending on where work is taking place.

The project expected to be completed and the road open by the end of August 2020.

## FUNDING

This project is expected to cost approximately \$3.5 million. Federal funding will cover 80 percent of the cost, with the remaining 20 percent shared by RCOC, South Lyon, Lyon and Green Oak townships and Oakland County general government (through the Tri-Party Program).
