II. PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Knight asked if any members of the public wished to address the committee at this time. No attendees requested to make a comment and Mr. Knight closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

III. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT – BRAD KNIGHT

Mr. Knight explained that due to COVID-19 and social distancing protocols the Federal Aid Committee will continue to meet and communicate through TEAMS. Mr. Knight reminded the attendees that only voting members of the committee can vote and referred to the list on attachment C in the agenda packet.

Mr. Knight announced that FAC is looking for at least two more volunteers to join the Technical Committee. Mr. Knight expressed that having more members on the Technical Committee will make the process easier and more efficient. Mr. Knight stated that if any attendees are interested in being on the Technical Committee to please contact Ms. Carissa Markel for information.

Mr. Knight reminded the attendees that RCOC will be conducting the biennial strategic planning meetings this year. Mr. Knight explained the meetings will be held virtually by default unless communities would like to meet in-person. Mr. Knight stated RCOC will be reaching out soon to schedule those meetings for the upcoming spring.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM SEPTEMBER 14, 2020 MEETING

Mr. Knight referred the committee to attachment A in the agenda packet for the minutes from the September 14, 2020 meeting and asked if there were any discussions on the minutes. No changes were requested.

Motion by Mr. Donald Green, Milford Township, supported by Mr. Bill Huotari, City of Troy, to approve September 14, 2020 meeting minutes. **Motion Passed.**

V. REPORT FROM Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG)

Mr. Stephen Brudzinski, SEMCOG, reminded the committee that at the end of this year SEMCOG will start working on the 2023-2026 TIP. Mr. Brudzinski explained that it is very important to maintain fiscal constraint of the TIP. Especially now with projects being programmed into JobNet and having to download an amendment package to MDOT. Part of the amendment package is a fiscal constraint report and being out of fiscal constraint will hold up the amendment period. In the past, being out of fiscal constraint by 3-5% was acceptable but now there is a very strict fiscal constraint policy.

Mr. Brudzinski stated the target amounts issued are the best estimates at the time, but every year there are a certain number of adjustments needed. There were more adjustments this year due to COVID-19 and the related in driving and unfortunately some projects funds were reduced, but this is the given climate of funding. Mr. Brudzinski explained that the FAC must stick very closely to these targets in order to stay within fiscal constraint.

Mr. Brudzinski announced that MDOT issued the call for projects for the fiscal year 2024 local bridge program this morning. The project applications will be due on April 5, 2021. This program has up to \$50 Million available statewide.

Mr. Brudzinski explained the Highway Infrastructure Program (HIP) has been around since 2018. HIP is a Congressional initiative and not under the general Federal Aid Highway Program or obligation authority, which means there are multiple years available to obligate and spend the funds. For 2021, there will be two separate HIP funds distributed, the HIP and HIP COVID Relief funds. There will be \$2 Billion available in 2021 HIP funds nationwide for various items, including

bridges, electric charging stations, scenic byways program, etc. Also, there will be \$10 Billion available in HIP COVID Relief funds. If MDOT distributes the funds, the same way as the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program then Oakland County could receive an estimated \$14 Million. The HIP COVID Relief funds can be spent on any eligible activities identified in the STBG program. Other eligible activities include maintenance, operations, personal salaries, debt services, revenue losses, etc. In addition, the HIP COVID Relief does not have to be put into the TIP. Mr. Brudzinski will give information and funding breakdown when the 2021 HIP funds come available.

VI. REPORT FROM Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT)

Mr. Ryan Doyle, MDOT, provided the committee with an update on various items from MDOT. The full report is included in Attachment A to these minutes.

VII. UPDATED VOTING MEMBER LIST

Mr. Knight referred committee to the updated voting member list in the agenda packet as attachment C. Mr. Knight stated the middle communities has a vacancy that will need to be agreed upon today in order to vote on the remaining action items.

Motion by Mr. Kevin Yee, City of Oak Park, supported by Mr. Mark Michling, City of Auburn Hills, to move Kevin Yee to voting member and Jim Surhigh, City of Birmingham, to alternate. **Motion Passed.**

IX. PROJECT LIST MODIFICATIONS

Mr. Knight introduced the agenda item and then asked the community to explain their request for project changes in the TIP.

STPU REQUESTS

The request to move three construction projects into different fiscal year. These changes will maintain fiscal constraint for both 2022 and 2023.

- Request to move construction project from 2022 to 2023.
City of Novi: Wixom Road from 790' South of Grand River Avenue to South City Limits. STPU amount is \$1,294,024.
- Request to move construction projects from 2023 to 2022.
City of Novi: Taft Road from 10 Mile Road to South City Limit. STPU amount is \$910,088.
City of Auburn Hills: Taylor Road from Joslyn Road to Giddings Road. STPU amount is \$561,000.

Motion by Mr. Bill Huotari supported by Mr. Allan Schneck, City of Rochester Hills, to move Wixom Road CON project from 2022 to 2023 and to move Taft Road and Taylor Road CON projects from 2023 to 2022. **Motion Carried.**

An updated TIP project list can be found in Attachment B to these minutes.

X. FY 2024 PROJECT SELECTION

Mr. Knight referred committee to the FY 2024 Project Selection list for the Cities and Villages in the agenda packet as attachment H. Mr. Knight explained the top four ranking projects points range from 63 to 67 points and there were four projects that tied with 61 points from Royal Oak and Oak Park. Mr. Kevin Yee explained that the City of Oak Park working with Ms. Holly Donoghue, City of Royal Oak, have agreed to fund 9 Mile Road from Cloverlawn Street to Republic Avenue, and Crooks Road from Main Street to Webster Road and they will split the shortfall of STPU federal funding and add that amount to their local match.

Motion by Mr. Kevin Yee, supported by Mr. Jeff Herczeg, City of Novi, to fund the first four top ranking projects and the 9 Mile Road and Crooks Road projects. **Motion Carried.**

Mr. Knight referred committee to the FY 2024 Project Selection list for RCOC in the agenda packet as attachment I. Mr. Knight explained the RCOC project list consisted of three resurfacing projects, one safety intersection project, and one pave gravel road project. Mr. Gary Piotrowicz, RCOC, stated that the RCOC will be looking for input from the locals where they would like to see projects in their community at the strategic planning meetings this year.

Motion by Mr. Bill Huotari, supported by Mr. Kevin Yee to approve the RCOC projects. **Motion Carried.**

An updated FY 2024 project list can be found in Attachment B to these minutes.

XI. OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Knight stated the next meeting is set for April 27, 2021. The meeting will be virtual unless in-person meeting is allowed. This information will be shared when the meeting dates gets closer.

Mr. Knight reminded everyone that the FAC is need of new members for the technical committee. Mr. Knight stated the technical committee will be meeting soon to review the

project application forms. Mr. Gary Piotrowicz explained the technical committee is very important, the technical committee rates the projects and makes sure there is uniformity and consistency among projects during this process. Mr. Gary Piotrowicz expressed that the Technical Committee is made up of representatives with a lot of experience, bringing new members on now will help train new people going forward. Please contact Ms. Carissa Markel if are interested in volunteering.

MDOT LAP Update

Telecommuting/COVID Update

- Staff working full time by telecommuting; very limited overtime and no travel
- Email is the best way to reach us; some staff have gotten cell phones

Funding

- FY21 is now fully funded. On the non-RTF side, we have about \$75M remaining.

SHPO

- LAP issued an Advisory and sent out a listserv regarding Section 106 consultation on November 2, 2020. When applying to the SHPO, 2 pieces of documentation are now required – FHWA's letter dated October 16, 2020 plus documentation showing the project is funded. The second piece may be a conditional commitment, selection letter, screen shot of the TIP, etc.

Program Applications

- New versions have been released updating the ROW pages related to water service line work. Please download and use the new versions dated 12/20.
- However, we have been informed of some technical issues with the fillable PDF areas of the form since the last update. We are troubleshooting it and will probably be releasing new applications again soon. In the meantime, the ROW area has also identified more clarifications to those pages.
- We were approved for an IT project to convert to a Web-Based Program Application, but we are probably still 2-3 years away from implementation.

Electronic Signatures

- Effective March 1, 2021, LAP will require all documents sent to us to be signed electronically. The DocuSign signature tool will be required – no ink scans, adobe signatures, etc.
- This continues the forward progress LAP and MDOT have made considering the pandemic.
- Exceptions include title/log sheets (may still be signed with ink and scanned/mailed to LAP) and cost sharing agreements/contracts.
- Additional information including training videos, software installation instructions and other information can be found on at www.michigan.gov/MDOT-esign or by emailing MDOT-esign@Michigan.gov. Can also see the LAP Advisory for more information.

Safety Program Update

- FY22 Call for Projects is complete. All applying agencies have been notified. Results:
 - 7 Systemic, 18 HRRR, 95 HSIP applications submitted
 - 6 Systemic, 15 HRRR, & 48 HSIP Selected - Estimated Award of \$15.8M
- FY23 Call for Projects was just released with an application deadline of May 3.

Bridge Program Update

- FY23 Call for Projects is Complete. 422 applications submitted.
 - 22 Replacements Selected; 58 Rehab/Preventive Maintenance Selected
 - Total Program Budget Approx. \$50M
- FY23 Call for Projects was just released with an application deadline of April 5th.

Obligation Concerns

- NEPA 5323 forms should be submitted ideally between 2-6 months prior to GI.
- When filling out page 3 of the program application forms, please make sure that the proposed funding matches JobNet. Local agencies can request access to JobNet.

- Also, keep an eye on project's engineer estimate throughout the design process. Our system will not allow us to submit for obligation if the engineer's estimate is not within $\pm 25\%$ of the approved budget in JobNet.

2020 Specification Book

- Final draft electronic version May/June 2021
- Printed Version will be available eventually.
- Required for all projects being with the August 2021 letting.
 - Do not plan for any flexibility. If you have designed to the 2012 book, make sure it makes a July or earlier letting.
 - The GI deadline for an August letting is March 8. Therefore, any GI packages submitted should now be designed to the 2020 Spec Book.
- A new HMA Selection Guideline can be found on our LAP website for the 2020 Spec book. Please note that the Superpave mixes have changed in the new Spec Book.
- If you use any Unique Special Provisions (SPs) for HMA or concrete, they must be reviewed and re-approved by MDOT and FHWA prior to use!
