

PONTIAC TRAIL RESURFACING, HAGGERTY TO GREEN LAKE, TO START APRIL 18

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC), in partnership with West Bloomfield Township, will resurface Pontiac Trail, from Haggerty Road to Green Lake Road, beginning on approximately April 18.

PROJECT DETAILS

The project will include:

- Removal of the existing pavement and replacement with 7.5 inches of new asphalt.
- Extension of the Pontiac Trail center left-turn lane from Green Lake Road west to Parkridge Dr.
- Extension of the Green Lake Road southbound right-turn lane onto westbound Pontiac Trail.
- Spot curb and gutter replacements.
- Upgraded pedestrian crosswalks to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Improved merging of the right lane of eastbound Pontiac Trail just east of Haggerty.

SCHEDULE

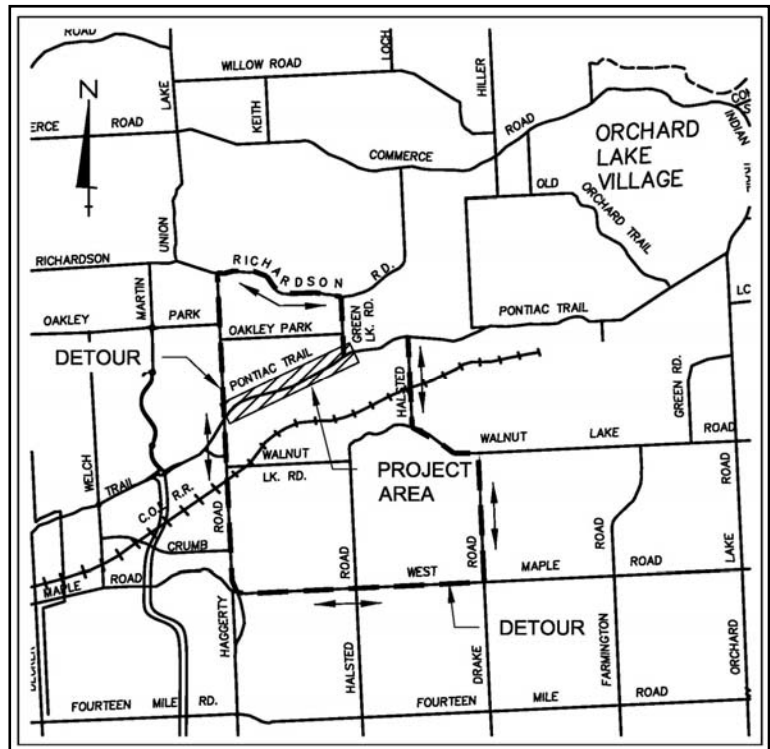
Work is expected to begin on approximately **April 18** and be completed by late summer 2022.

IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

This section of Pontiac Trail will be closed to through traffic throughout construction. Access to homes and businesses within the project will be maintained at all times.

Additionally, **Green Lake Road will be closed to through traffic between Pontiac Trail and Richardson Road for approximately one month during the project.**

The **detour route for Pontiac Trail through traffic** will be Haggerty Road south to Maple Road east to Drake Road, north to Walnut Lake Road, west to Halstead Road and north back to Pontiac Trail and vice versa.



The **detour route for Green Lake Road through traffic** (during the one-month closure of Green Lake) will be Green Lake Road to Richardson Road to Haggerty Road to Maple Road to Drake Road to Walnut Lake Road to Halsted Road to Pontiac Trail and vice versa.

PROJECT COST AND FUNDING

The project is expected to cost \$2.5 million. Eighty percent of the cost will be paid for with federal funds. The remainder will be shared by RCOC, West Bloomfield Township and Oakland County general government (through the Tri-Party Program).
